Looking at **Theophany** from the **50,000ft view**

1. WHAT is a theophany?

- A Greek compound word (theos) + (phainein, meaning "to appear") = "an appearance of God."
- A definition used in worship: "anytime God appears in a visible form that humans can see."

2. WHAT's the PURPOSE of theophany?

- Main purpose: To make God's presence known. Theophanies are always divinely initiated.
- Other purposes:
 - o To command = Exodus 3 with Moses and the Burning Bush
 - o <u>To judge</u> = Job 38:3 and 40:7 with, "Dress for action like a man, I will question you..."
 - o To encourage = Joshua 5:13-15, Isaiah 6:1-6
 - o To invoke awe = Daniel 3:30

3. Are there different TYPES of theophany?

- YES! God can appear as whatever He wishes, but some common ones seen in Scripture are: (these Scripture verses are only a few examples, not all)
 - o Thunderstorms = Exodus 19:16
 - o <u>Heavenly courtrooms</u> = Isaiah 6:1-6, Daniel 7
 - o <u>Human</u> = Exodus 24:9-11; 33:22-23
 - o <u>Warrior</u> = Joshua 5:13-15
 - o <u>Chariots</u> = Ezekiel 1:15-21, Psalm 18:10
 - o Glory & clouds = Exodus 40:34-38, 1 Kings 8:10-11
 - An "imprint" of God's glory = Exodus 34:29-35
 - o Fire = Genesis 15:17-18, 1 Kings 18:20-40
 - o The "Angel of the LORD" = Genesis 16, Judges 13

4. WHY are there theophanies?

- To bring HOPE
- Pointing to a future day where there's permanent, everlasting <u>communion</u> with God and His people. Theophanies in the Bible are *temporary*. Jesus Christ is the ultimate theophany that is *everlasting*.
